
Toys for Keys Kids Toy Collection Drive

South Florida Water Management District – Seeking Public Input on Draft Strategic Plan




The [South Florida Water Management District](#) (District) is a regional governmental agency that manages water resources in the southern half of the state, covering 16 counties from Orlando to the Florida Keys. Created in 1949, the agency is responsible for managing and protecting water resources by balancing and improving flood control, water supply, water quality and natural systems. Key initiatives include the restoration of the Everglades, as well as improving the Kissimmee River and its floodplain, Lake Okeechobee, and South Florida's coastal estuaries.

The District is seeking public comment for their Draft 2025-2030 Strategic Plan. The plan serves as a blueprint for achieving balanced regional water resource management. The District updates the Strategic Plan annually to highlight its work to continue advancing Everglades restoration, protecting communities from flooding, meeting the region's water needs, and engaging the public and stakeholders over the next five years. The strategies and commitments outlined in the Draft 2025-2030 Strategic Plan will be put into action to make a positive and meaningful difference for the people and the environment of South Florida. The FDOT Five-Year Tentative Work Program



If you are interested in projects that the Florida Department of Transportation is proposing to be completed in Monroe County over the next five years, you may wish to attend their upcoming public hearing, either virtually or in person.

As added background, FDOT hosts an annual public hearing to develop their Five-Year Work Program. The hearing is one step in an ongoing process used to allocate funds for priority transportation projects planned for the next five years. The Work Program is based on their best available forecasts of project costs and funding, ensuring that the Department has the financial capacity to implement planned projects.

BIRDING IN ISLAMORADA (CLASSES BEGIN DECEMBER 9) – The first installment of Birding in Islamorada with Program Leader Rachel Dipietro, Naturalist and Bird Expert will take place on December 9 at Founders Park. Enjoy a leisurely walk in the park and bird watching with Rachel! Classes will begin with a short introduction on the birds in the Islamorada area, followed by identification and discussing traits and habits of the birds that are observed. Binoculars and bird field guides are recommended! All adults 18+ are welcome to attend, classes are \$9.00 per person. 24 MILES IN 24-HOURS SWIM CHALLENGE (DECEMBER 7 & 8) – The Friends of the Pool, in partnership with the Parks department, will be hosting the 24 Miles in 24-Hours Swim Challenge. ISLAMORADA NATURE WALKS & TALKS (CLASSES BEGIN DECEMBER 16) – The first nature walk and talk with Program Leader Susan Kolterman, Florida Keys Naturalist, will take place on December 16 at Anne's Beach (MM 73). The goal of the series is to increase knowledge of flora and fauna of the Florida Keys and Everglades National Park while promoting responsible stewardship of our natural resources. These walks involve a brief discussion on the history of the Upper Keys as well as plant, butterfly, and bird traits. Sturdy shoes, sunscreen, water, binoculars, and/or a camera are recommended.
