ROGO Conversation to Continue at December 10 Village Council Meeting

On December 10, the Village Council will reconsider the number of ROGO allocations and distribution cadence. As you may recall, our prior Village Council had directed that 104.75 allocations be requested to be distributed over a period of 12 years. Household Hazardous Waste Collection – December 13 and 14

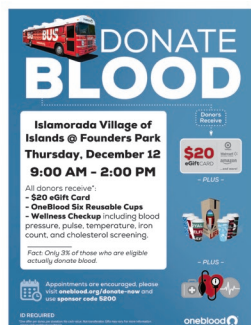

Celebrating Success: Climate Adaptation and Resilience



The Florida City and County Management Association hosted a short-form video showcase and competition highlighting municipal climate adaptation and resilience initiatives across the state of Florida. Village staff prepared a submission focused on our recent Founders Park breakwater restoration.

By raising the breakwater two feet, the marina is better protected from future storm surge, sea level rise, and erosion. This fully grant-funded project is just one of the many resiliency efforts the Village is undertaking to reduce risk and mitigate the adverse impacts associated with climate change. The breakwater stayed within the existing footprint and is currently closed to the public while we monitor mangrove restoration along its borders.

Plan, Do, Check, Act: Validating Canal Restoration Success on Plantation Key



As part of the Village's greater effort to improve water quality and nearshore ecosystems across all waters, various canal restoration projects have been completed throughout the Village. In January 2024, a canal backfilling project was completed within Canal 116, located on Plantation Key between Plantation and Ocean Drives.

Prior to the project, monitoring revealed that extremely poor conditions existed within the canal, with very low oxygen levels and high turbidity. It also indicated there was no growth of any kind of plant or coral on the bottom of the canal.

Our ecosystem restoration effort included refilling part of the canal to cultivate improved circulation, oxygenation, and other ecosystem benefits. The results revealed that it does not take long for plants to colonize once the oxygen levels improve. By reducing the depth of the canal through backfilling and eliminating the anoxic zone that existed, a life-giving environment was created!

In less than a year, monitoring results revealed that seagrass and important macroalgae carpeted about 50% of the bottom of the canal. Starlet coral was also observed growing. This was a complete turnaround in canal life and an excellent indication that overall water quality conditions in the canal had improved tremendously. Village consultants will continue to monitor conditions on the bottom of the canal on a biannual basis. This is a success for both wildlife dependent on the habitat and for residents along the canal!

We planned the project, implemented it as planned, monitored the results to make sure that our strategies are producing the intended outcomes, and our future actions continue to be informed by the learnings from this and other important projects. By applying the Plan-Do-Check-Act method for project development and implementation, we maximize positive outcomes while honoring both our environmental and fiscal stewardship responsibilities.
